The California Subminimum Wage to Competitive Integrated Employment Project (CSP) is focused on preparing individuals with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities to work in the communities of their choice earning a competitive wage. Participants receive services at one of two community college campuses with the goal of supporting self-sufficiency and independence for those individuals with the most significant disabilities currently in, or contemplating entering, subminimum wage employment.

The California Department of Rehabilitation is partnering with North Orange Continuing Education (NOCE) and San Diego Community College District (SDCCD) to provide services that support full inclusion for Californians with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities. One of the long term goals is to identify innovative practices that can be implemented statewide. Participants in the program engage in the activities listed below.
